new exhibit in the Stafford Room, "Overflowing with Hope: The Hidden History of Japanese Americans in Alameda," open now until July 23. At the turn of the century, many Japanese people immigrated to Alameda, where they built a thriving community.

On Feb. 2, 1942, the government designated Alameda as a Restricted Area due to the presence of the Naval Air Station. When President Roosevelt issued Executive Order 9066, Japanese Americans in Alameda were the first Californian group to be evacuated and eventually relocated to Topaz Mountain in Utah. All signs of Japantown vanished.

The library's exhibit is the first of three parts in the Japanese American History Project funded by the National Park Service. This part documents the removal of citizens and businesses through images, testimonies and artifacts. The material will be archived in the Densho Digital Repository and the Internet Archive.

Library Director Jane Chisaki submitted the grant and worked with partners from the Buena Vista United Methodist Church, the Buddhist Temple of Alameda, the Internet Archive and Rhythmix Cultural Works to make this project possible. Brad Shirakawa is the Project Director.

## Marjorie B. Ryan

Marjorie B. Ryan passed away peacefully surrounded by her family on May 12, 2023.

She was greeted in heaven by her husband of 69 years Walter H. Ryan Jr, her eldest son James F. Ryan, her brother Lucien T. Rankin III (Skip) and her parents Lucien and Josephine Rankin.

Marjorie is survived by her daughter Pattie DiFraia, son-in-law Chris, sons Danny and Mike Ryan, daughters-in-law Yvette Ryan, Laurie Santos and Sheila Ryan, her grandchildren Nick and Megan DiFraia and great-grand-

sons James and Conner Linde. She is further survived by her sister MaryAnn DeMerritt, brother-in-law Gary, sister-in-law Felicia Rankin and numerous nieces and nephews.

Marjorie was born on Feb. 8, 1931 in San Francisco. At the age of six, she moved to Alameda but still spent a huge amount of time in the city at the home

of her grandparents who loved her dearly and spoiled her rotten. She was an only child for the first 13 years of her life and enjoyed being the center of attention. Marjorie attended St. Joseph's Elementary

School and graduated from Notre Dame High School.

As a teenager, Marge aspired to become a beautician but a career day visit from a nursing program changed the direction of her life. She attended Mary's Help Hospital College of Nursing graduating in 1952 and earned her Registered Nurse certification in 1953. She was initially told that her specialty should be in the psychiatric department but Marge found her calling working in obstetrics in the new born nursery.

After a 45-year career, she retired from nursing in 1996 after making Alameda Hospital her home for 43 of those years. During this time, she often told stories of babies born to Oakland A's or Raider's team members that
