12%. Have you forfeited your social security checks, or are you planning to donate them?

Another wonderful statistic, many of which your opinion piece lacks, is that the 13 million people living in poverty in this country do not receive any benefit from welfare programs. This means no subsidized food, subsidized housing, and/or healthcare. These 13 million who are more likely to be at-risk for homelessness than those who do use assistance, precisely because they did not receive aid as a preventative measure.

Lastly, and perhaps worst of all, I think you might actually like paying \$7.00/gallon for gas since you do not want any intervention on current prices. The horror.

I also want you to have access to government assistance. Not because you need it but because it's your right.

I've lived in Europe where healthcare is free, and a dentist appointment was only \$20. There were no hidden fees, no premiums, and assistance is accessible to all. There was also no arbitrary income amount that would disqualify you from receiving aid. So, God forbid you need an ambulance and emergency care — you wouldn't need to pay \$7,000 from your savings. You probably could pay for it but using that money to invest in something like your education to get a bet-

ter understanding that assistance is only 5% of the USA Gov budget.

Europe is not a utopia due to not having social welfare, but that's not the point of government assistance.

The point is that governing bodies have a responsibility to keep their people safe and well — especially when a majority of industries do not take that responsibility for their own workers; and the jobs that were outsourced aren't coming back.
