As someone who is deeply involved in Corica Park's Junior programs, I would like to clear up the confusion and address the disparaging remarks made towards the management of the park in the Alameda Sun.

**Outdoor Recreational Space in Alameda Must Be Preserved**  
 Editor:  
 The recent article in the Alameda Sun about a developer proposal to build housing on the current site of the Harbor Bay

Club, ("Development Company Applies to Redevelop Harbor Bay Club Site," May 18) left out the most important detail of the plan — nearly all of the outdoor recreational space will be taken away. The Sun article also failed to expose the propaganda in the proposal as will be shown in this letter. I hope in response to this letter, the Sun will write a follow up article since the first article contained little more than what is stated in the proposal from the developer.  
 The developer that wants to build 400 housing units on the land that currently is occupied by the Harbor Bay Club claims they understand the importance of the existing recreational facility to the community. However, these are empty words if you look at what they are proposing. In the proposed development package, the developers state the following: "The Development Team acknowledges the importance of the Harbor Bay Club to the immediate

community so we will completely overhaul the existing club and introduce a brand-new, full-service state of the art 25,000 SF fitness club, which is larger than the existing Harbor Bay Club." This is a highly deceptive statement. The "fitness club" they are proposing is an indoor gym and it may be larger than the existing indoor gym. However, the proposal removes approximately 95 percent of the outdoor recreational facilities. Therefore, the new club will not be larger than the existing club. It will be approximately five percent of the size of the existing club!  
 The Harbor Bay Club currently has the following outdoor recreation facilities: 18 tennis courts, a six-lane swimming pool, four pickleball courts, a full-size basketball court, a children's playground, grass fields where kids can play tag, soccer, catch, etc. These facilities are on approximately eight acres of land. The proposal from the developer has

the following outdoor recreation facilities: two tennis courts (on the roof of the parking garage) and a six-lane swimming pool. According to the proposal by the developer, these facilities will be 24,400 square feet of outdoor recreation space. That is a little more than half an acre!  
 We cannot lose outdoor recreation space in light of the new housing that is coming to Alameda. I support the new high-density housing that is being proposed throughout Alameda in the Housing Element of the General Plan.  
 I am a Harbor Bay resident and I especially support the proposal to rezone the Harbor Bay Shopping Center to allow for housing above the retail businesses. As we add thousands of new residents to Alameda, it is imperative that we maintain outdoor recreation space. The proposal to take away the outdoor recreation space at the Harbor Bay Club would mean
