Frances Teresa Miller, née Tramontana, was born in August, 1943, in Alameda, CA, and she died February 5, 2021, peacefully at home surrounded by her loving family after a courageous battle with cancer.

She grew up in Alameda, attending St. Joseph's Elementary School and later Notre Dame High School and dearly loved the Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur. She had many friends among children in her school and neighborhood and a large loving family with many aunts and uncles.

She graduated Providence College of Nursing and she spoke very fondly of her time working with young unwed mothers at Booth Memorial as well as her years at Herrick Hospital in Berkeley where she developed lifelong relationships with some of her dearest friends. Both of her children became RNs, following in their mother's footsteps.

While in nursing school, she met the love of her life, Randy Miller, from Jamestown, NY Her mother, father, grandparents, aunts and uncles had all originated from Jamestown as well and had moved to the San Francisco Bay Area during WWII. While growing up, she spent a great deal of her time with

her grandparents Grace and Sam, parents Rose and Joseph, and Aunt Jean and Uncle Bill. Fran and Randy took good care of her family members as they grew older.

Fran and Randy liked to travel, both with Randy's parents, Paul and Edith, also of Jamestown and Lakewood, and with friends as well. They loved New Orleans as a special place.

They treasured the steamboat trips they enjoyed together. They became very active square dancers and campers and spent many weekends trailer-camping in the local Northern California area to attend 3-day dances. Fran joined the Ligure and Colombo Clubs with daughter Teresa to celebrate and embrace her Italian heritage.

Fran went back to school later and completed a Bachelor of Health Sciences. She continued to work at Alta Bates Summit Medical Center in Berkeley as a psychiatric nurse until 2010. After retirement she and Randy continued a very active square dance schedule and learned to line dance as well, making many new friends along the way.

Fran was the most beautiful and colorful person and the very best of cooks, with a great fond-

ness for cookbooks of which she had a wonderful collection. She was also the very best of listeners, with a kind and compassionate ear. Fran was also a seamstress of the highest caliber, whatever her project of the moment: school uniforms, senior prom dresses or dance club costumes — she was capable of sewing anything.

She is survived by her husband Randy, son Paul and his wife Teresa Elaine and son Charlie, daughter Teresa Marie and her partner Bruce and their sons Aaron (Kate) and Noah (Hannah), friend Bende and many others who will miss her dearly every day but who had the good fortune to be loved by her. The Miller family would like to thank everyone for their support during Fran's two years of treatments in Santa Monica. She was buried in St. Mary's Cemetery, Oakland, CA, near her mom and dad, aunt, uncle and grandparents.

We family members count ourselves as the luckiest people to have closely shared her life through good times and difficult ones, most of us for over half a century. ## USPS Operation Santa Program Now Accepting Letters

The Postal Service is accepting letters for the 109-year-old USPS Operation Santa program. Letters must be postmarked by Dec. 10 and will be uploaded to USPSOperationSanta.com through Dec. 15 for potential adoption.

USPS Operation Santa was established by the Postal Service to help those in need during the holidays. The nondenominational program is intended to help as many deserving families as possible experience a happy holiday season.

Participation in USPS Operation Santa is simple. All you have to do is write a letter, put it in an envelope affixed with a First-Class Mail Forever stamp, and make sure you include your full return address — apartment number, directional information (i.e., E Main St, Apt 103) and ZIP Code — and send it to Santa's official workshop address:

**Santa Claus  
 123 Elf Road  
 North Pole, 88888**

Letters without full return addresses or names will not be posted for adoption.

When someone writes a letter, it is opened by Santa's "elves," and for safety reasons, all personally identifiable information of the letter writer is removed (i.e., last name, address, ZIP Code) and uploaded to USPSOperationSanta.com for adoption. Letters must be

postmarked by Dec. 10 and letters will be uploaded to the website for adoption through Dec. 15.

There is no guarantee that letters submitted to the program will be adopted. All the information you need to write a letter, address an envelope, put on a stamp and send it on its way can be found on USPSOperationSanta.com.

Adopter registration, ID verification and letter adoption will open in the next few weeks. Potential adopters, once approved, can visit USPSOperationSanta.com, read through the posted letters, pick one or more that they'd like to fulfill, and follow the directions on how to grant that special wish for a child. For security reasons, all potential adopters must be vetted through a short registration and ID verification process before they can adopt any letter. If you've adopted letters in the past, you must still be verified each year.
